Child and Adolescent to Parent Violence and Abuse (CAPVA) is where a young person (8 years -18 years) engages in repeated abusive behaviour towards a parent or adult carer. Abusive behaviour can include physical violence; emotional, economic, or sexual abuse; and coercive control. It may also include damage to property and abuse towards other family members, particularly siblings.
